WHAT DO YOU NEED TO GRADUATE:

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) requirements:

- 30 credits/courses in total:
 - 17 compulsory credits & 13 elective credits



- In addition to courses, students must complete:
 - pass the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) (minimum of 300 score out of 400)
 - minimum grade of 70% on a Financial Literacy Test taken in grade 10 math class
 - 40 hours of Ministry approved community service hours
 - minimum of 2 online learning credits (will have the option to opt out in gr.11)
- Students need to complete before the end of GRADE 10 ONE Arts credit (visual arts, music or grade 10 drama) and ONE technology course

Community Service Hours



- •All students are required to complete **40** community service hours with a **NON-PROFIT** organization
- Students must receive pre-approval and complete a form <u>BEFORE</u> they start any activity. Forms can be found in the Student Services office or our school's website
- When a student completes their activity, they will need to bring in a formal letter on the organizations letter head indicating the activity, number of hours completed with a signature into Student Services
- Only hours completed after their grade 8 graduation can be counted

Course Selection

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- Students will take <u>8 courses</u> in grade 9
- 6 Compulsory courses + 2 elective courses
- Students in our Family of Schools (Our Lady of Fatima, Guardian Angels, St. Scholastica, St. Veronica, St. Benedict (F.I) and Lumen Christi (E.F)) will work with the elementary school itinerants and enter courses into My Blueprint (opens Nov. 20th)
- Parents must approve the courses in My Blueprint via an email. Otherwise, courses will not be processed
- There is a \$65 Student Activity fee also that needs to be paid by Cash-on-line. Visit the school website https://secondary.hcdsb.org/stkateri for access to Cash-on-line. Activity fee is important to help enhance all student's educational and high school experience. Helps pay the cost of student events, guest speakers, buses to events, yearbook and supplies such as locks for lockers etc.



Parent email approval. Your plan will not be approved by a guidance counsellor until we receive confirmation that a parent/guardian has reviewed and approved your plan. Make sure you enter the correct email address. An email is sent to a parent from My Blueprint not St. Kateri. If a parent doesn't approve the plan, and would like to make changes, they will need to email the school to reset the plan, then resubmit the plan.



Non-HCDSB Students School Registration & Other Information

- Students who are not attending one of our Family of School's or are not currently a student in the Halton Catholic District school board, will need to complete an Online Registration Application. Please go to www.hcdsb.org for more information on completing this registration form. Once your application has been approved, St. Kateri will contact you and forward the necessary information to complete course selection and registration. Registration is now open for the 2025-2026 regular program school year.
- <u>Out of Boundary Students</u> if you live outside the St. Kateri's boundary and are a student of HCDSB you will need to complete an Out of Boundary Request form. You can obtain this form from any HCDSB elementary schools or high-schools. All forms are to be sent to a superintendent. Once approved, St. Kateri will contact you with further instructions.
- No cross-boundary forms are needed if coming to St. Kateri for a specialty program, pre-IB, pre-AP, Extended French or French Immersion

Students who are in our Family of Schools and are interested in applying for a pre-**IB** program or pre-**AP** programs are required to <u>first submit</u> courses for the regular program in My Blueprint and pay the activity fee to St. Kateri by Dec. 13th first. If students are accepted into the **pre-IB/AP program**, St. Kateri will change the courses to reflect the appropriate program.

Pre-IB/AP course codes do not show up in My Blueprint

HCDSB students who our outside our boundary and are applying for pre-IB or pre-AP programs must submit courses to their home school first. If accepted into St. Kateri's pre-IB/AP program, the home school will transfer their courses over to us and we will make the necessary changes.

Review & Timelines



- 1. Guidance counsellors will be visiting our Family of School's grade 8 classes next week
- 2. <u>Dec. 13th</u>: Students must submit their course in My Blueprint & pay the \$65 activity fee. Approval email to parents/guardians. My Blueprint will be open by November 20th.
- 3. <u>Dec. 13th:</u> Registrations from **non-HCDSB** students are due & \$65 activity fee. Make sure you are registering for the 2025-2026 school year.
- 4. Changes to electives can be done until <u>APRIL 1st.</u> Once September begins no changes can be made to elective courses.
- 5. <u>August 2025:</u> Grade 9 Orientation Day students will receive their timetable, tour the school and be assigned a locker. Information will be on our school website in August.
