Differences between Programs: AP and IB

Advance Placement (AP)	Diploma Programme (IBDP)
<p>Opportunity for advance standing in university [If they do not write their AP exam, they do not have advanced standing].</p> <p>Institutions do not automatically receive notification that a student wrote an AP exam.</p>	<p>Opportunity for advance standing in university.</p> <p>Since our students write their IB exams, they have an opportunity to receive a transfer credit, depending on the university.</p>
<p>Taken on a course-by-course basis.</p>	<p>Offers a complete program and with an internationally recognized diploma.</p>
<p>Only receives an OSSD.</p>	<p>Receives OSSD and IB Diploma.</p>
<p>Mark is based solely on an end of term AP exam in Grade 12.</p>	<p>Marks determined by both internal assessment and final IB exams.</p>
<p>Students must send their Grade 12 exam results to the post-secondary institution.</p>	<p>All Grade 12 marks are converted from IB final exams to Ontario marks and submitted to OUAC (and dependent on student performance).</p>

Preparation for the rigor of post-secondary education

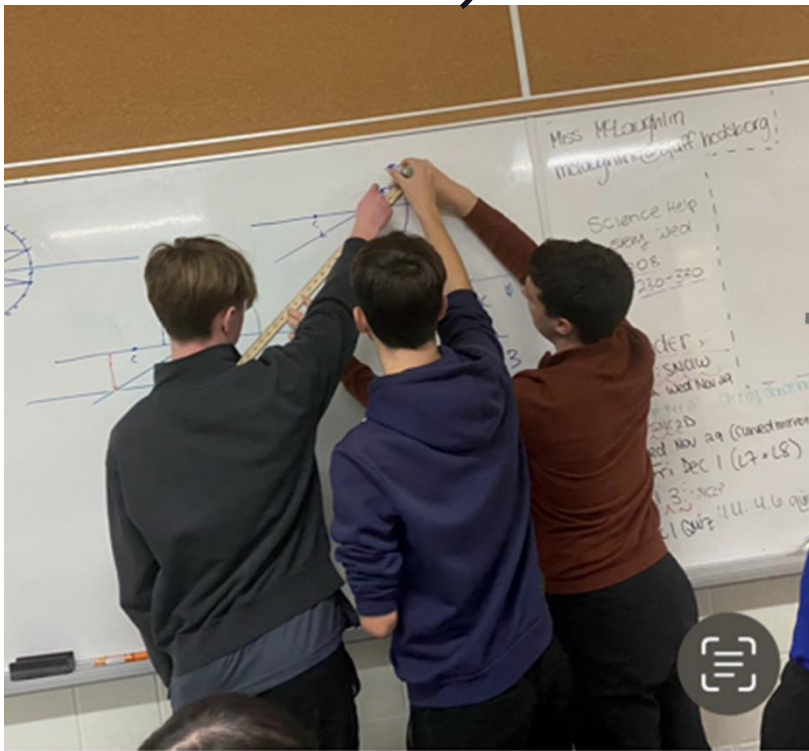
Educates the whole person

What is the *difference* between Pre-IB and IBDP?

The school's preparatory years are Grade 9 and Grade 10 (**Pre-IB**).



The IB Diploma Programme [**IBDP**] is TWO years. It begins in Grade 11 (Year 1) and ends in Grade 12 (Year 2).

IBDP CORE

Extended Essay (EE) – Grade 11 & 12 Requirement

- Up to 4,000-word investigation of a topic of special interest outside of the regular curriculum which acquaints diploma candidates with independent research and writing skills

Theory of Knowledge (ToK) – Grade 11 & 12 Requirement

- Challenges students to question the basis of knowledge, to develop the ability to analyze evidence and to appreciate other cultural perspectives

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) – Grade 11 & 12 Requirement

- Continuous community involvement demonstrating reflective and experiential learning

Combining Programs with IB

- SHSM students may also pursue the IB Diploma Programme [IBDP] – students will consult with their guidance counsellor to plan their pathway
- Students in the IBDP will be prepared to challenge the AP Exams or the DELF in their Grade 12 year
- Students are recommended to keep their doors OPEN - apply for Pre-IB Grade 10 + build skills such as thinking, communication, research, self-management and social skills while working towards their OSSD and preparing for the IBDP

Pre-IB (Gr. 10) to IBDP (Gr. 11, 12)

- **Pre-IB Grade 10** is a discernment year: students build critical thinking, research, global awareness and personal growth skills necessary for learning and achievement
- For Grade 11, Pre-IB Grade 10 students may either pursue the IBDP or transfer into another program
- **Please Note: Students must take Pre-IB Grade 10** to have the prerequisites to enter the IBDP Year 1 in Grade 11! (i.e. Grade 11 Math in Semester 2 of Grade 10)

For New Applicants (Gr. 9 Students NOT in Pre-IB)

Grade 9 Students Applying to join Kateri's Pre-IB Grade 10

Application Process:

- Submission of the **Application Package (online or hardcopy)**
- Instructions will be available on the St. Kateri Tekakwitha C.S.S. Website in the IB section, often near the end of November in your Grade 9 year: <https://secondary.hcdsb.org/stkateri/> - **or** visit Student Services to pick up a hardcopy of Application Package
- Conditional offers will be sent out throughout January and February

Pre-IB and IBDP Programme Fees

- Grade 10 Pre-IB: \$400 CAD, non-refundable
- Grade 11 IBDP, Year 1: \$850 CAD, non-refundable
- Grade 12 IBDP, Year 2: \$1350 CAD, non-refundable

- Fees are used to provide resources and training specific to the IB Programme, Grade 11 and 12 fees include IB exam costs

- **Please Note:** Programme fees subject to change by HCDSB, please see most current information on our school website in the IB section

- Families residing north of the 407 (Milton and Halton Hills) will apply to St. Kateri Tekakwitha C.S.S.
- Students residing OUT of district and applying for cross-boundary entrance – Brampton, Wellington and North Mississauga - will apply to St. Kateri.
- Students residing in Niagara, Hamilton and South Mississauga - will apply to St. Thomas Aquinas C.S.S. in Oakville.
- Students from Burlington may choose either option, pending the distance and convenience of where they reside within the city.

Cross Boundary + Transportation for Specialized Programs

- The Pre-IB, IBDP, and AP-Prep are specialized programs
- As per **HCDSB Policy 1-04**: Transportation is only provided for students living within the St. Kateri boundaries who qualify for busing according to board policies.
- As per **HCDSB Policy 1-04**: Cross Boundary students attending the Pre-IB and IB DP programs DO NOT require a cross-boundary form.

- Cross Boundary students are responsible for their own transportation
- **Students in a specialized program whom “OPT OUT” of the program will be required to return to their home school based on the HCSDB Boundary Map**
