
## Health & Safety

**COVID** Protocols:

- Complete Pre-Screening Tool Daily. Please DO NOT come to school sick or not feeling well.
- Complete the Covid-19 Daily Self-Assessment procedure each day. Be ready to show the green screen before entering school/portable/classroom.
- If you are feeling ill and/or unsettled at school, please notify your teacher immediately.
- Ensure that you are practicing all physical distancing guidelines both on and off school property (e.g., adhere to entrance door and washroom zone expectations)
- 3 Safety Pillars: masking, hand washing, physical distancing



## Anaphylaxis



- No eating or food in the hallways.
- ▶ No students in the hallways during class.
- Snacks must be eaten at your assigned desk only. Bring a labeled reusable water bottle.
- Ensure that you dispose of your garbage in the appropriate receptacle.
- Refrain from using body sprays, colognes and perfumes.





# Smoking & Vaping



- Not allowed on school property a Provincial law. Suspension if caught smoking/vaping on school property.
- Please remember you must be 19 years of age to smoke; if caught smoking during school hours, please remember consequences can range from fines to suspension.
- No smoking/vaping in cars.
- By-law officers will fine students found on school property based on the Smoke-Free Ontario Act.
- Suspensions will be issued (2 days minimum) for smoking/vaping and/or in **possession of a vape device** or **vape paraphernalia on** school property. Vapes WILL be confiscated.



## Attendance and Routine

- Get the proper rest, nutrition and movement breaks that you need each day.
- Be on time for class and <u>remain engaged</u> during the call. If you have questions, ask your teacher or log into VAS (Virtual Academic Support) that runs from 12:35 – 1:50 p.m. daily.
- Do your best each day…
- Teachers will have a conversation with you and parents, as well as your VP when absences become a concern. Remember that if you are logged in, you should be actively learning. When teachers check in, you are expected to respond.



# Attendance/Uniform (in school)

- Have parents/guardians report on the School Messenger App the day of any absence due to illness or appointment.
- If you become ill during the day at school, report to the office.
- Before leaving the school, you must sign out in the attendance office. When returning, please sign in.
- Ensure you are dropped off by 8:20 a.m.
- Full uniform is expected each day. Teachers will send you to the attendance office if you are out of uniform.

- Arrive on time to minimize class disruption.
- You must be in class before the bell. <u>Class begins at 8:20</u> <u>am</u>. The entrance doors will open at 8:05 a.m. and locked at 8:35 a.m. If you arrive 20 minutes late or more, enter through the main doors and obtain a late slip from the attendance office.
- Classroom teacher communicates home regarding first 4 lates.
  - 5<sup>th</sup> late referral to V.P.
  - Signing in late at the office and not reporting to class may result in a suspension. Use classroom designated washroom zones and avoid walking the halls.



## Civvies

- School appropriate clothing only;
- Remember that attending school is like going to your job: dress respectfully.
- No hats;
- Administration reserves the right to decide what is appropriate.



Academic dishonesty is a serious offence. Ask your teacher for clarification if you are uncertain.

It is a student's responsibility to be honest in all aspects of schoolwork so that the marks received are a true reflection of your own achievement.

Natural consequences may include assessing a mark of zero on the assignment, test or culminating activity, as well as a conversation with the teacher, VP and parent.



## Busing



- Extension of the school be respectful and follow the rules - wear a mask; sit in your assigned seat; face forward.
- Must be on the registered list to ride the bus.

## Mental Health

- Talk to someone who cares (friend, parent, teacher, chaplain, guidance counsellor, admin)

# Electronic Devices



- Electronic devices may only be used in the classroom for educational purposes <u>under the</u> <u>direction of the teacher</u>.
- Phone calls are to be made outside.
- The school is not responsible for lost or stolen devices.
- Inappropriate use of electronic devices may lead to suspension.



## Virtual Behaviour

- Distributing inappropriate pictures or text messages by phone or through social networking sites and hacking (manipulating images and/or videos) will result in disciplinary action and police will be contacted.
- No recording of teacher instruction due to privacy reasons.
- Words are powerful. Choose them carefully. Use appropriate and encouraging language when posting opinions, critiquing others and chatting on school platforms.
- Only represent yourself online.



Inappropriate Behaviour

- School consequences will result when inappropriate behaviour occurs on school property, during school events, or if an event occurring off school property affects the climate of the school.
- Racism, harassment, vandalism, substance abuse, plagiarism (from sources and/or from classmates) defiance or disrespect of a staff member, bullying or cyber-bullying (acts towards fellow classmates or community), mobbing, extortion and fighting will result in disciplinary action.

Do NOT choose a course in myBlueprint for the next school year if you are planning to take it in summer school. Choose another!





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
