Fact Sheet for Business SHSM

The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program, which is part of the Ministry of Education's Student Success initiative in the province of Ontario, has been introduced to offer province-wide specialized programs in specific ministry-identified sectors to support the success of all students. The SHSM Program has a number of required components, designed to give students a "leg-up" to pursue post-secondary opportunities in each of the identified sectors, valuing all 4 destinations. The components are as follows:

- Bundled Credits: Each SHSM program offers students a bundle of 9 11 credits, including:
 - 4 "major" credits in the Business sector in Grade 11 and Grade 12
 - 2 or 3 supporting credits in English, math or science that will be delivered in the context of that sector
- Contextualized Learning Activities: Supporting credits, such as English, math, or science include units and other opportunities for SHSM students to learn in the context of the Business sector
 - i.e. a student taking a SHSM construction program completes a unit in their math course determining the proper measurements to build a construction project
- Certifications and Awareness Training: Sector-recognized certifications related to the Business sector and selected from a list, both generic and specific to support the sector (i.e. WHMIS, First Aid, CAD / CAM Training)
- Experiential Learning Opportunities:
 - Job-shadowing, job-twinning, work experience
 - Minimum of 2 cooperative education credits linked to Business Studies
 - Field trips, other workplace experiences for students to explore careers related to the Business sector
- Reach Ahead Experiences: Within the student's chosen post-secondary destination, ranging from a few hours to full courses (dual credit programs)
- Clearly valuing and providing a pathway to all four post-secondary destinations, apprenticeship, college, university and work

Choose courses with your Lead Teacher/Guidance Counselor that will fulfill your SHSM course
requirements using the above chart to guide you.
When filling out your option sheet for next year check the SHSM box in MyBlueprint
Arrange an interview with the Program Lead Teacher for acceptance into the Program

Components of Your Business SHSM Program

Step 1: Select your courses using Program Pathways: SHSM-Business

This chart shows program requirements for the SHSM—Business in Grades 11 and 12, along with some of the additional credits needed for an OSSD. It is provided to help guide students in choosing the credits they need to meet the SHSM requirements in the pathway of their choice. Students should always review their pathways plan with their parents/guardians and their teachers/guidance counselor to ensure that they have all the credits they need to graduate with an SHSM—Business.

- Shaded boxes represent required credits in the bundle
- for the SHSM–Business.
 (C) represents a compulsory credit for the OSSD.
- The SHSM bundle of credits must include two cooperative education credits, but may include a maximum of four. The possible options are noted below, and explained fully in Section A1.2 of this guide.


Step 3. Experiential learning and career exploration activities

Experiential learning and career exploration opportunities relevant to the sector might include the following:

- one-on-one observation of a cooperative education student at a placement in the business sector (an example of job twinning)
- a day-long observation of a business person (an example of job shadowing)
- a one- or two-week work experience with a member of a business association or a professional in the sector (an example of work experience)
- attendance at a retail show (e.g., a home show or craft show), conference, or workshop focusing on the business sector
- participation in a local, provincial, or national contest or competition with a focus on business (e.g., a business plan competition or stock market competition)
- working with a mentor within the business community (e.g., to provide assistance in creating a business plan)
