What do you need to graduate?

In order to obtain your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (O.S.S.D) you need:

18 Compulsory Credits:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (1 credit at the senior level)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- .5 credit in career studies
- .5 credit in civics

What do you need to graduate?

PLUS one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1: Additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or other international language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance & Career Education or Coop

Group 2: Additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business Studies, or French as a second language or Coop

Group 3: Additional credit in senior level science, or Technological education, or French as a second language or computer studies or Coop

Alternative Courses

- These alternate course selections will be used in case one of your originally selected courses is not running or if there is a course conflict (i.e., 2 courses in the same period, unable to be moved).
- Please choose these wisely!
- The alternate will automatically be put in if either of the scenarios mentioned above happen.





Community Involvement (40 hours)

Alternatively, you can submit a letter from the organization (on letterhead) that outlines the details of your involvement. A letter is required for any activities >40 hours. Return the letter or form to Student Services.

Summer School (July)

- 4-week courses are offered:
 - For repeating a failed course
 - For earning a reach-ahead course
- Registration will take place via myBlueprint in Spring 2024. Listen to announcements for details and check the school website and @stfxguidance Twitter and Instagram.
- If you plan on taking a course in summer school, do not select it in myBlueprint. If it is a compulsory course, you will have to show proof of completion in September.
- You may enroll in only one course.

Pathway Programs



















- Students receive credits toward their OSSD while at the same time earning College credits in a specified program
- This helps in the successful transition from high school to College and Apprenticeship programs



Co-op & Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

- Get hands on experience in a career/profession of your choice and an employment opportunity.
- Explore Apprenticeship through a **CO-OP** work placement by turning it into an OYAP.
- Students can be registered as an apprentice while still in high school
- 2 weeks pre-placement preparation
- 3 hours a day in a workplace environment
- Monthly integrations sessions back at school





Why Consider Chef/Baker Concentrated OYAP at St. Francis Xavier?

- •The Chef/Baker Concentrated OYAP is a program specifically designed to help students make a smooth, successful transition from high school directly into their post-secondary Cook/Chef Apprenticeship.
- •It is the best course offered in our high schools to prepare students for a career in a Baker/Pâtissier Apprenticeship.
- •It is free! Similar pre-apprenticeship programs are offered at community colleges and private technical training centres where they cost between \$2,500 and \$6,500.




Eligibility

- ☑ Grade 11 or 12 students (Grade 11 students are encouraged to apply, but preference will be given to Grade 12 students).
- ☑ Be at least 15 years of age by February, eligible to work in Ontario, and have a social insurance number.
- ☑ Have a strong interest in pursuing a career as a cook or food service professional.
- ☑ Have taken at least 1 Hospitality and Tourism (TFJ) course in either Grade 10 or 11.
- ☑ Demonstrates a positive attitude towards school and work.
- ☑ Have a proven record of good attendance and punctuality.

SHSM

A Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program includes the following components:

- **1. Bundle of credits**: A defined bundle of credits consisting of eight to ten Grade 11 and Grade 12 credits, including cooperative education credits
- **2. Certification and training experiences**: Sector-recognized certifications and/or training courses
- **3. Experiential learning:** career exploration activities within the sector
- **4. Reach ahead experiences**: Learning experiences connected with the student's postsecondary plans
- **Sector-partnered experiences**: Experiences in which students engage with a sector partner to explore sector-related content, skills, and knowledge involving either ICE (innovation, creativity, and entrepreneurship), coding, or mathematical literacy.



University Admission Requirements



In Ontario you will apply via OUAC, and your transcripts will be sent automatically by the school board. Due date to apply is in January.



Universities **OUTSIDE** of Ontario: it is the student's responsibility to research and apply directly to the university. Be aware of application deadlines.



Planning to attend a university/college in the U.S? You may need to write your **SAT**s. Plan early. Find a testing facility. Begin your research now!



Planning Considerations


Research university/college programs and their course requirements using **myBlueprint**, **ontariocolleges.ca**, or **OntarioUniversitiesInfo**. Every university program can have different requirements.


For example, Engineering programs usually require Physics, Chemistry, and Math, while Health Science programs require Biology, Chemistry, and Math. All programs require English!

You should also check the admission requirements on the university's website. In particular, check to see if repeated/upgrade courses are accepted.
